Ahmedabad snatch win from Chennai's grasp

on the third, Perera did no on the third, Perera and not look threatening. But he upped the ante, setting the course alight with six birdies, one on the from nine (8th hole) and five on the back nine (10th, 11th, 14th, 17th and 18th).

Perera was overjoyed as he anchored the win, after being a part of the winning team in both the 2012 and 2014 editions.
