Chennai Shocked On **Dramatic Final Day**

Bengaluru: Powered by a brilliant back-nine charge by the Sri Lankan duo of Mithun Perera and Anura Rohana on the final day, holders Navratna Ahmedabad scored a sensational victo-ry to retain the Louis Philippe Cup at

the KGA course here on Saturday.
Five shots behind pacesetters
TAKE Chennai at the start of the day,
the diminutive Perera shot a five-under 67, including five birdies on the backnine, while Rohana returned a card of 71 with two birdies in the second-half, including a nervy 10-footer birdie putt on the closing hole to go ahead for the first time in the Rs 1.2 crore event.

Although homeboy Khalin Joshi birdied the final hole, he could only help Chennai draw level with Ahmeda-

bad.
The latter, by virtue of their better final-round score of six-under 138, edged out Chennai (143) and walked away with the winners' prize amount of Rs 36 lakh with a three-day tally of 13under 419. It was Ahmedabad's third victory in

four editions.

With both SSP Chawrasia and S Chikkarangappa failing to fire on the

final day, Khalin's heroic effort of 12-

under 204 went in vain for Chennai. Despite finishing on 419, the team had to settle for the runners-up purse of Rs 24 lakh.

The consolation for Chennai, who

did all the running on the first two days, was the individual honours for the inform Khalin, who was one of the two golfers to shoot sub-par rounds on all

three days.

Prakash Chouhan (209). While Khalin

rrakasi Choluna (209). While Khalin took home Rs 7 lakh for his efforts, Chouhan was richer by Rs 4 lakh. While most golfers struggled on a windswept day, the 29-year-old Perera, the only player to have stayed with the

Ahmedabad team since its inception. made the difference with his brilliant iron-play.

He kept attacking the flag regularly, and barring the final hole, where he sank a 15-footer, rest of the four birdies on the back nine were in the two- to four-feet region.

"It feels great to retain the title," Perera said. "It was a brilliant team effort and we knew we could bridge the five-shot deficit if we played to our po-tential. We (Anura Rohana and Shankar Das) combined well as a team," he

Khalin struggled on the day but managed to submit a two-under 70 card. If not for the lip outs on the 13th and 14th holes, the script would have been totally different. "It's disappointing not to be able to close out," said Khalin. "Hats off to Ahmedabad for a fine comeback victory."
